Our next Reunion is in San Antonio, with side trips to Fredericksburg and Corpus Christi. It will be hosted by Bill/Lin Brinkman and Hubert/ Linda Jackson. Taxi and shuttle service to the hotel is available from the Airport so you do not need a rental car. The one way Yellow Cab taxi fare today is \$23.64 (not including tip) total for 1 to 6 passengers (depending on luggage) and is the best deal. The shuttle is \$16 per person each way. Joe Murdoch will be coordinating arrival and departure times for those who want to taxi pool.

You really do not want to miss this event which will be our sixth reunion. The first was Mobile in 2003 and was set up by Bill Brinkman and co-hosted with the Submarine Sea Owl Association. The second was Charleston in 2004 and was coordinated by Cal Cochrane, Jerry Coutu, and Bill Luttrell. These were followed by the 2006 in Virginia Beach headed by Ivan and Marjorie Joslin, the 2008 in Jacksonville led by JJ and Sonja Lynch, and the 2010 in Branson coordinated by Joe and Stella Murdoch. You can imagine how much work goes into these reunions by your hosts and coordinators who do a wonderful job on our behalf. Each was fantastic and were an absolute joy to participate in. There is so much to do and to get back in contact with your shipmates is an incredible experience.
